



HORIZON GAÏA

RULES

- 1. Horizon Gaïa is an incentive grant that will be awarded every autumn by the Musée international d'horlogerie (International Watchmaking Museum [MIH]), primarily in collaboration with the Watch Academy Foundation and other partners.
- 2. The aim of the grant is to fund an individual project to be completed within a year. The project must be able to start in the calendar year following the awarding of the grant.
- 3. The recipient, who must be aged 18 or over when the application is submitted, is chosen on the basis of the project presented, without regard to gender or nationality.
- 4. The grant is awarded to the best project in one of the three categories of the Prix Gaïa:
- History and research in the field of time measurement
- Arts and creations in watchmaking
- Entrepreneurship in the watchmaking industry
- 5. The application must contain at least the following:
- A letter of motivation
- A curriculum vitae
- A project presentation (max. 10 pages)
- A detailed budget
- A letter of recommendation

It will also indicate any resources, excluding financial, that the applicant is seeking from MIH and the benefits of the project for MIH.

- 6. The application deadline is 21st March each year.
- 7. After validating the proposals, the management of the MIH convenes a jury of experts to assess the applications. A member of the Watch Academy Foundation is part of the selection committee.
- 8. The jury's decision is final and not subject to appeal.
- 9. The recipient of the grant is announced at the Prix Gaïa ceremony. The winning project is publicly unveiled at the ceremony.
- 10. The recipient agrees to allow MIH to use his or her identity and project to promote the grant.
